BRITISH-YUGOSLAV LAW ASSOCIATION

Following a reception at the Law Society (equivalent to Bar Association) in London, England, in December 1990, there has now been established the British-Yugoslav Law Association.

The objects of the Association are to encourage and assist professional relations between lawyers in the United Kingdom and lawyers in Yugoslavia and to promote better understanding of the legal systems of the two countries. To do this, the Association intends to hold conferences and workshops in both countries and to arrange exchanges and placements of lawyers, where appropriate.

The Committee of the Association is established and it is hoped that the Association will hold its first full meeting in June or July 1991 in London.
